Now we are planning for the Fall Membership Meeting, “Bee Thankful” in November and I am looking forward to it.

Some of you have been wondering “What are the benefits of belonging to the Arizona Quilters Guild? Let’s look for some of those benefits: (By the way, we are planning to develop a new AQQ Brochure soon.)

1. Fellowship with other quilters-especially if you belong to a chapter.
2. Take classes from experts at reduced prices. (since AQQ underwrites some of the expenses to bring a speaker, our members can take advantage of their expertise at a lower rate than non-members)
3. Protection from liability in case of personal injury to non-AQQ members or property damage to non-AQQ facilities.
4. Keep up with the happenings (quilt shows, classes, speakers, etc.) around the state and elsewhere through the *Patchwork Chatter* monthly newsletter.
5. Access to new ideas, designs, show winners, tips and thoughts through the Facebook page as we make it more robust.
6. Participate in AQQ sponsored events such as the Quilt Show, retreats (being planned), etc.
7. Access to the website that is being updated frequently to keep our membership informed of AQQ events, chapter events and other items of interest
8. Opportunity to attend membership meetings to learn more about quilting and happenings around the state

Chapters have the same and additional benefits such as:

1. Financial assistance with charity projects with the Mini-Grant Program
2. Ability to spread the word of chapter-sponsored events to all AQQ members through Facebook, the newsletter and the website
3. The ability to solicit funds and donations with the support of AQQ
4. The opportunity to present some speakers, events, etc. with the financial assistance and encouragement from AQQ
5. Liability Insurance coverage for meetings, events, retreats, etc.
6. Opportunity to share experiences, speakers, etc. with other chapters to reduce the cost to an individual chapter
7. Opportunity to attend chapter leadership meetings for information, training and sharing of ideas

So, you see there are many benefits (even as a member-at-large) some you may not have considered.

QUILT SHOW ENTRY

The deadline is **DECEMBER 13, 2019**. Judged entries will be limited to **230**. Submit your entry as soon as possible. The quilt does not have to be completed prior to entering. However, the photo must show a recognizable quilt.

When you enter your quilt online, once you have completed the form, be sure to hit the **SUBMIT** button, and keep a copy for your records. If you have correctly entered your quilt online, **YOU WILL RECEIVE AN EMAIL WITHIN FIVE MINUTES CONFIRMING YOUR ENTRY**. If you do not receive an email, your quilt is not entered. Reenter it; make sure you get an email confirmation and make a copy for your records.

After you submit your entry, you will be directed to the Volunteer Sign-up website. We strongly encourage all entrants to volunteer at the quilt show. Many hands make light work.

CHAPTER CHALLENGES: The limit for Chapter Challenges has been received. The application has been removed from the website. However, if your Chapter is still interested in displaying a challenge, send an email to the quilt show director. If space is available, they may be displayed.

OPPORTUNITY QUILTS

Requests for Opportunity Quilts will end when allotted space has been filled or November 15 deadline.

Limited to first four applications received and priority given to Opportunity Quilts not previously displayed or had the opportunity to sell tickets at an AQG quilt show. For example: If a chapter sold tickets for their “Sunburst” quilt at the 2019 quilt show, then they will not be given priority for one of the four allotted slots. However, if that chapter makes a new quilt “Irish Chain,” then they would be eligible for priority.

QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE: Positions available, print advertising, volunteer assistant and hanging assistant, door prize coordinator and 2021 Quilt Show Director.

AQG Education is pleased to present Kelly Cline as the keynote speaker at the 2019 Fall Membership Meeting on November 16. Classes with this National Educator will be held during the week of November 18th.

Kelly Cline lives in Lawrence, KS and has a love of many things; family friends, fabric, quilts and vintage. Kelly has developed a way to create fabulous creations using vintage cloths such as handkerchiefs, linens and doilies with quilting techniques. Her lecture will show how she has re-purposed and saved beautiful vintage items by transforming them into creations on domestic and long arm machines.
