



Wanda's creations demonstrated the properties Terial Magic and what it can do to create a quilt that pops. Erica uses couching and artificial flowers and stems to create unique pieces of artwork. Kate Morgan also showed several of her quilts using traditional quilt blocks and an interesting way of folding the fabric to make it stand out.

Any Night Owls wanting to participate should bring their finished quilt to the December 12th meeting. Night Owls will vote on their favorite.

Night Owls has a lending library! You must sign up to get a "library card". Books can only be checked out for one month and returned at the following meeting. See Penny if you have any questions.

### DAISY MOUNTAIN QUILTS OF VALOR

Quilts of Valor Foundation (QOVF) is a national organization whose mission is to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor. There are currently over 600 QOV groups in the United States. One of the newest Groups to form is in Anthem Arizona, named Daisy Mountain Quilts of Valor (DMQOV).

DMQOV formed in March of this year after having the Prescott Group give a presentation at a general meeting for Daisy Mountain Quilters. The group currently consists of about a dozen quilters with affiliation to the Arizona Quilters Guild - Daisy Mountain Quilters and Foothills Quilters.

DMQOV presented their first quilt on Armed Forces Day, May 20, 2023. The quilt was awarded to Master Sgt Summer C., on the anniversary of her 20th year with the United States Air Force. In June, our Group coordinated with another Group in Maryland to present our second QOV. In July, one of our members traveled to Texas and presented four additional quilts.

Our Group is dependent on volunteers as well as donations to purchase all the supplies needed to create these quilts. We have participated in a couple Farmer's Markets local to us in Anthem to spread awareness of our Group. We held a Quilt Raffle at these Farmer's Markets to generate funds. We are collecting printer ink cartridges for recycling. Our leadership has given presentations at general meetings for Daisy Mountain Quilters, Foothills Quilters, and Busy Bees. How can you help? Being a new Group of QOVF, Daisy Mountain QOV would appreciate any new fabric donations. If you are a quilter, or know of one, who would like to donate fabric to our Group, please reach out to DaisyMountainQOV@gmail.com.

There are also costs associated with administration, this includes brochures, business cards, and venue fees in our local area to bring recognition to our Group. Anyone can nominate a living service member or veteran that has been touched by war so we can wrap them in comfort and thank them for their service. "Touched by War" may be direct or indirect; from direct combat no matter where or when, caring for casualties either in the field or in hospitals overseas or stateside, serving in harm's way by providing support or supplies, being wounded, providing casualty assistance to families of the fallen, ministering and supporting those who struggle with the demons that interfere with their life after war.

Nominations can be made at www.QOVF.org/nominations-awards. Volunteers are always welcome. Volunteers are needed in many areas even without the ability to sew; being an extra set of hands during Group sew time, awarding Quilts, and fundraising. DMQOV meets monthly for a Sew Day to work as a Group on quilt tops, in addition to working individually throughout the month. We also have an informal monthly general meeting to plan fundraising and coordinate presentations.
