From the President:

Hello Quilters!

I have a Halleluia moment to share with everyone this month! We have finally made a decision about the venue for the Quilt Arizona! Show in 2025!

Quilt Arizona! 2025 will be held once again at the Mesa Convention Center BUT there will be two important changes.

1. Instead of March, the show will be held on January 15-18th, 2025.


2. The intake and judging of the quilts will be done January 12-14th at a different location. Though there will be more effort involved in doing the intake and judging elsewhere, it will save several thousands of dollars off the cost of the show. Once this location is finalized, we will announce it to everyone.

I want to share that locating, screening, and negotiating with possible venues has been a time consuming and frustrating process. We contacted over 40 possible venues both in the Phoenix area and outside of Phoenix including casinos, hotels, community centers, colleges, civic centers, conference centers, churches, lodges etc. What we learned is there are very few locations that have enough space for our quilt show and are also within our budget. We also learned that verbal cost estimates from a venue can differ quite a bit from the actual costs listed in the contract we receive.

Throughout the process, our team persevered (though some of us may have more gray hair than we used to). I am confident we've made the best decision. I would like to extend my <u>heartfelt</u> <u>thanks</u> to everyone who was involved in this project. It was most definitely a team effort!

Vendor registration is still in process and going well.

Volunteer registration opened on January 5th. While it doesn't close until March 15th, it's much more helpful to us if volunteers would register earlier vs. later. We sleep better at night if we know we have the help we will need. Please register if you haven't already. And, thank you for volunteering.

We have a new Youth Program this year called "Next Gen" (next generation of quilters). Around the beginning of March, a voucher will be sent to all members that will allow free admission for 1 adult bringing a child under 18. If the child participates in the Next Gen activities on either Friday or Saturday afternoon, they can enter a drawing for a new sewing machine. Let's create the next generation of quilters!

Cactus Patchers of Tempe






