In October, Jo Kilgroe demonstrated an Art Abstract project. Members brought colorful pictures from magazines. They then drew a grid on the picture. From piles of donated scraps, they searched for fabrics containing the colors in each square. The scraps were trimmed to a standard size and arranged according to the colors within each grid. From these, a small abstract quilt top could be made. (See samples.)

November was meeting-less but at least 35 Delights gathered for our 2<sup>nd</sup> Sew-cial. Many of us worked on quilted Christmas stockings. Others spent their time on charity quilts. Still others worked on holiday gifts. All of us found it to be a relaxing time spent with each other, catching up, with lots of laughs and even sharing impromptu demonstrations on how to do something quilty.

December's meeting was a gathering of the Elves. The name refers to our many members who make quilted Christmas stockings for those served by Devereux Advanced Behavioral Health. More than 600 stockings were donated this year! Monica Chapman from Devereux shared that these stockings, filled by members of other organizations, are given to children in foster care. Afterwards, more than 70 of our 100+ members enjoyed playing games, winning door prizes and Elf prizes, looking over this year's challenge quilts and enjoying a catered brunch. This year's challenge quilts, "24 in '24," were as diverse as their makers. The rules were simple: make a quilt 24" x 24" featuring 24 of something and incorporating a recognizable amount of the provided red fat eighth on the front of the quilt. Viewer's Choice winners in

#### **Desert Threads Members Enjoy the New Season With Interesting Meetings**

Our members come from many different communities in the East Valley and enjoy quilts with a variety of techniques and styles. We meet in the Sun Lakes Oakwood 'Computer Training Center' on the 2nd Wednesday mornings. At the November meeting Claire Victor talked about her progress creating quilts to enter in shows, especially the QuiltCon Show. QuiltCon is produced by the Modern Quilt Guild, an organization with many local groups from around the world. In 2025, QuiltCon will be in Phoenix, watch for the dates. Claire showed slides and actual examples of her beautiful work. January 15, Claire will teach a class using improv techniques to make an art quilt of face caricatures. At the December 13 meeting Desert Threads members presented the finished quilts that had been in the 'making it' stage from before 2023. These are called 'UFOs' (UnFinished Objects) or might also be known as 'PUPs' (Poor Unfinished Projects).

Alyce Leach spoke at the December 13 meeting and will teach a class in February. Alyce high-lighted her road learning to quilt and showed some superior examples in her trunk show. She explained how she grew in her skills and now does beautiful curved piecing. She will teach us a class in February using 'Sew Kind of Wonderful' rulers for doing curves.

Diana Jones continues to present a new Block-of-the-Month at each meeting for members to make and show at the next meeting. Members are finding these blocks interesting and challenging. When all blocks have been revealed each participant will put their blocks into a quilt. Organizers of The Bazaar table at the Sun Lakes Womens' Association Holiday Bazaar in November reported on the great success of this first time effort and thanked the members for the many, many gorgeous quilts that were donated for this fund raising activity. A few of the quilts did not sell and have been added to the collection of quilts made by members for local charities, such as The US Vets in Phoenix. The January 10 meeting will feature Pam Rockley lecturing about 'Ten Sisters' patterns and techniques. Attendees will learn about this easy piecing technique.

### **Rippers**


