## 2024 QUILT SHOW ENTRY RULES AND PROCEDURES Please Read Carefully

1. Entry forms must be received no later than midnight, January 6, 2024. Entries received after this date will be returned. All Exhibitors must be members of Arizona Quilters Guild, except for Exhibitors in the Youth Category. There is no fee to enter.
2. Submit ONE (1) entry form per entry. Exhibitors are limited to a total of three (3) entries, only two (2) of which may be judged. The two judged entries may be entered in the same category (see also Rule \#7 below.) Chapter Challenge entries do not count towards the three-entry limit. Display Only quilts will be hung based on space availability.
3. The entry form must include a photo of the entry to be used for identification purposes. The quilt does not need to be completed, but the quilt top should be recognizable in the photo.
4. All entries must have been completed after March of 2021 and cannot have been exhibited at a previous AQG show. Submissions for the Special Collection are exempt from this rule.
5. Only 220 judged quilt entries will be accepted. Quilts will be accepted for judging based on the order the entry forms are received. Entries submitted into judged categories after the limit is reached will be given the opportunity to change to a Display Only category or to withdraw the entry. A quilt shown in Display Only will not be eligible for entry in future years.
6. Quilts made from kits (including blocks of the month with fabric packets) or "cheater cloth" must be placed in the judged "KIT QUILT" category. These entries will not be eligible for the Best of Show or Best Use of Color awards. Panel quilts may be entered in any category unless the panel was purchased as part of a kit.
7. The AQG Judging Committee reserves the right to split a category by quilt perimeter size, or to combine like categories together. Exhibitors with affected Entries will be notified of such a decision as soon as possible.
8. All entries are subject to copyright laws. All Exhibitors are required to give credit for all inspiration derived from other quilts, books, quilt makers, patterns, photographs, etc.
9. No profanity or suggestive language in the quilt description or on the quilt will be accepted. No distasteful images may appear on a quilt for judging or display.
10. All entries must consist of three layers (top, batting/stabilizer and backing) unless entered in either the Art Abstract or Art Innovative Category.
11. All entries must contain quilting unless entered in the Other Category. Tied quilts will not be accepted (excluding crazy quilts or youth quilts). Quilts with a false back will not be eligible for awards.
12. Quilts mounted on wood stretcher bars or framed (wood or metal), with or without glass, will not be accepted. No accompanying items will be hung with the quilt, i.e., glass or ceramic, storyboards, photographs, etc.
13. The AQG Judging Committee reserves the right to reject any entry, re-categorize any item, or disqualify any item from the judging portion of the quilt show. Exhibitors with affected Entries will be notified of such decision as soon as possible.
14. All entries must be clean, free of pet-hair, and odor. Any entry which reflects any of these conditions will not be accepted by the Intake or Judging Committees.
15. All entries must have a hanging sleeve. The hanging sleeve should be 4" wide (or appropriate for the size of the quilt) and sewn to the quilt; quilts with pinned sleeves will not be accepted.
16. Quilt WIDTH may not exceed 108". All quilts longer than 85 " must have a hanging sleeve placed 85 " from the quilt bottom. The quilt top will then be draped over the hanging pole. The sleeve placement will prevent the quilt from touching the floor.
17. A 2024 Entry Label must be pinned on the lower left-hand corner when looking at the back of the quilt. This required label will be included in the Entry Confirmation Packet. Labels or other information (on the front or back of the entry) identifying the artists must be covered with fabric or paper and secured with basting stitches or safety pins. Please do not use straight pins.
18. The Entry must be delivered to the show in a cloth tote bag that securely closes and completely contains the Entry. Do not use plastic bags or boxes. Do not wrap the entry in fabric, nor include any padding (like pool noodles).
19. The cost of shipping quilt entries to and from the show is the Exhibitor's responsibility. All mailed quilt entries must include a prepaid return shipping label unless the entry will be picked up at the quilt show Return Event. All mailed entries must adhere to rules \#17 \& \#18 regarding Labels and cloth bags.
20. Judging will be done by the elimination method. First Place, Second Place, and Third Place Awards MAY be awarded in each category at the sole discretion of the judges. Ribbons are awarded to the quilt entrant for the Solo categories, to both artists for the Duet categories, and to the named quilter for the Exemplary Quilting ribbons.

## QUILT SHOW DEADLINES

- Saturday, January 6, 2024 - Entry form and identification photo must be received no later than midnight, January 6, 2024. Use of the online Quilt Entry form is encouraged; the form is available on the AQG Web site at www.arizonaquiltersguild.org. To request a printed entry form, please email quilt_entry@aqgmail.org or call the Arizona Quilters Guild office at 480-827-8458.
- Week of February 18-24, 2024 - An Entry Confirmation Packet detailing acceptance, drop-off or mailing procedures and sleeve construction will be e-mailed or mailed to each entrant.
- Sunday, March 17, 2024 - ENTRIES MUST BE DELIVERED BETWEEN 10:00 am and 1:00 pm to the Mesa Convention Center, Mesa, AZ, unless previously dropped off at the designated DropOff locations which will be included in the Entry Confirmation Packet. Mailed quilts must be received by Wednesday, March 13, 2024. Postage information will be included in the Entrant Confirmation Packet.


## RECOGNIZED SPECIAL AWARDS

All award decisions of the judges are final. Judges determine selection for the Special Awards from any of the Judged Categories.

## DEFINITIONS OF QUILTER CLASSES

Note: the non-professional vs. professional distinction is only used in the determination of the Exemplary Hand-Guided Machine Quilting awards.
Non-Professionally Quilted. The entry was quilted by someone who quilts for themselves as a hobby or quilts for others for no or minimal compensation.
Professionally Quilted. The entry was quilted by (a) someone who previously or currently is engaged in machine quilting as a source of livelihood. This includes, but is not limited to, machine quilting for others, teaching machine quilting, or publishing about machine quilting. Or the entry was quilted by (b) someone who has won Quilting Awards at National Quilt Shows. Professional quilters must also designate themselves as such for their own quilt show entry.

## DEFINITIONS OF QUILTING STYLE

Machine Quilted - Computer Guided. The quilt was quilted using a stationary or track-mounted machine with a computer guided system. Not sure? Please ask your quilter. Quilter may be professional or non-professional.
Machine Quilted - Hand Guided. The quilt was quilted using a stationary or track-mounted machine and all quilting designs were guided by hand. Not sure? Please ask your quilter. Quilter may be professional or non-professional.
Hand Quilted. The quilt was quilted by hand, without benefit of any machines.
Not Quilted. Only for entries in the OTHER Category that are traditionally not quilted, or Youth Quilts.

## DEFINITIONS OF DESIGN

Original Design. Entry design is the original work of the Entrant and/or the artists identified as creating the piece. Design is not derived, copied, or translated from any other resource.

Published Design. Entry was created following a published design from a book or pattern, possibly with minor modifications. Publication and author/designer must be identified.
Inspired Design. Entry was created based on inspiration from another source (pattern or image), but with significant modifications. Resources must be identified.
Traditional Block Design. Entry was created using well recognized, traditional quilt blocks without the use of any published patterns. Block setting may be traditional or unique to entry.

## CATEGORY CRITERIA

Size: If the AQG Judging Committee decides to split a category by size the Entries will be grouped according to the quilt perimeter measurement. The actual split will depend on the Entries submitted in the category, however, common Entry sizes are as follows:

Solo and Duet Categories: Entries made by two people (a Duet) are judged separately from entries made by a single person (Solo). Both people in a Duet category should be identified on the entry form. The Entry may be submitted by either person in the Duet; the category ribbons will be awarded to both people who participated in the Duet.

## DEFINITIONS OF NON-JUDGED CATEGORIES

Display Only: Any quilt construction technique may be submitted to this category. Tied quilts are not accepted.
Chapter Challenge: All entries from an accepted Chapter Challenge are displayed together. A Chapter representative must apply separately and be accepted to this Quilt Arizona! show before individual entries are accepted.
Youth Quilter: Any quilt submitted by an Entrant under the age of 18 years. Youth Entrants are not required to be AQG Members; there is no entry fee for this category. There are no quilt technique restrictions, and the entry may be Solo, Duet, or Group. Quilts in this category may be tied. These quilts are for Display Only, but they will be reviewed for the Barb Spitalny Youth Choice Awards.
85+ Quilter: This special Display Only category is available to celebrate those to whom quilting is a lifelong journey. Any Entrant aged 85 or older may choose to enter this category. If desired, the Entrant's age may be included in the Entry Description. There are no quilt technique restrictions, and the entry may either Solo or Duet.
Special Collection - Log Cabin Quilts: Quilt Arizona! would love to showcase your beautiful Log Cabin quilts, from antique to wonky modern, and everything in between. The quilt can be any age as long as it is clean, it is in generally good condition, and it has a securely attached hanging sleeve. The quilt does not need to have been made by the Entrant, but in the Entry Description please share as much information as you know about the maker and the story behind the quilt.
Only one (1) submission per Exhibitor; this does not count towards an Exhibitors three quilt limit. Up to 40 submissions will be initially accepted; the Entry Team will select enough quilts to fill the available space. All will be notified in February 2024.

## DEFINITIONS OF JUDGED CATEGORIES

Appliqué: Appliqué predominates over piecing or other techniques either in amount or effect. Automated Machine Embroidery should be entered in the Machine Embroidery category. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries. This category may be split by Entry size.

Art/Abstract. An original design meant to be used as a piece of art in abstract form.
Art/Innovative: An original design meant to be used as a piece of art, reflecting innovative techniques, subject matter, and/or materials.

Group Quilt: Any quilt constructed, quilted, or bound by three or more people. There are no quilt technique restrictions in this category.
Hand Quilted: A quilt that has been completely quilted by hand. No machine quilting is allowed.
Kit Quilt: A quilt where any part of the quilt fabric has been provided as a "kit" or a "Block of the Month" including fabric packets, or "cheater cloth". Panel quilts may be entered in any appropriate category unless the panel was included as part of a kit. Quilts will be judged within the category, but are not eligible for either the Best of Show or for Exemplary Use of Color awards. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries.
Machine Embroidery: Machine embroidery predominates over piecing or other techniques either in amount or effect.
Mixed Technique: A quilt that reflects multiple techniques used in the design and construction of the quilt top. This may include, but is not limited to, Piecing, Machine Appliqué, Hand Appliqué, Machine Embroidery, Hand Embroidery, or significant Embellishments. The complexity of the quilt top should be more than just setting blocks together. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries. This category may be split by Entry size.
Modern: Quilts may include the use of improvisational piecing, decorative stitch work, substantial negative space, bold colors, high contrast, and graphic areas of solid colors. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries.
Other: Hand Embroidery, Cathedral Window, Crazy Quilt, Whole Cloth, Yo-yos, etc. A quilt reflecting any of these techniques. Entries in this category that can be quilted, should be quilted.
Paper Pieced: Piecing using foundation piecing methods predominate over any other technique either in amount or effect. This does not include English paper piecing. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries.
Pictorial: A quilt that represents a recognizable image of a person, place, or thing. The design may be original or based on a pattern. All entries must consist of three layers and contain quilting, or significant thread painting, that secures the layers.
Pieced: Piecing predominates over any other technique either in amount or effect. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries. This category may be split by Entry size.
Scrap: Quilt top is comprised of 50 or more different fabrics. This category is available for Solo or Duet entries. There are no quilt technique restrictions in this category.
Time-Span: A quilt started by a previous generation(s) and finished by today's generation. May be made from vintage blocks, tops, antique linens, or other textiles. Vintage items may have been made by one or more artists/needleworkers.

## Theme: The 2024 AQG Quilt Show theme is Hip To Be Square.

Squares are straight, classic, and traditional with names such as Nine Patch, Log Cabin, and Four Patch. But straight lines can be trendy and cool. Go against the norm and make squares hip! Hip To Be Square - where square is the new cool.

All entries in this Category must reflect designs inspired by this theme. You must submit a 150 word (approximately 1000 characters) Theme Statement that describes how your quilt interprets this theme. The statement will be displayed with the quilt. There are no quilt technique restrictions in this category. Quilt perimeter not to exceed 450 ".
